“Making A Change Academy” 2013 Trainings

Synopsis: The Correctional Preservice Make a Change Academy consists of a one-week curriculum that is designed to assist employees in developing knowledge, building skills, and providing educational activities related to staff responsibilities in a juvenile correctional environment. Participants receive instruction on a variety of juvenile correctional topics.

Target Audience: All new staff that work in a juvenile facility will attend the Making a Change Academy in addition to completing the Regional Preservice Academy, weeks one, two, three and four.

<p>Division of Youth Services (DYS) Overview 1.5 hrs. To provide an overview of the Division of Youth Services, focusing on the four juvenile facilities and programs offered at each facility</p>	<p>Effective Interactions with Mentally Ill Students 1.0 hrs. To provide participants with tools in communication, de-escalation, and active listening when working with juvenile offenders (students) who may be suffering from a mental disorder.</p>
<p>Your Responsibility in Making a Change 2.0 hrs. This module provides an overview of programs and techniques that all juvenile facility staff have a responsibility to be familiar with to establish control, maintain safety, and prepare students for re-entry.</p>	<p>Why Try Program Overview 2.5 hrs. This module provides an overview of the Why Try Program, including its mission, treatment principles, teaching methods, purpose of, and lessons learned in the Why Try Program. An overview of Why Try activities is provided, the ten visual metaphors of the Why Try Program which are reinforced by journaling, discussion, art, music, and hands-on activities.</p>
<p>Trauma Informed Care 7.0 hrs. To provide participants with information regarding Trauma Informed Care, and how their role as a staff member influences the treatment of students.</p>	<p>Supervising High Risk Students 3.0 hrs. This module provides participants an overview of the high risk students housed in IDOC facilities, what behaviors can be expected, and intervention techniques.</p>
<p>Understanding & Managing Adolescent Behavior and Preventing Sexual Harassment 3.0 hrs. This module provides participants with the knowledge and skills to understand what can be expected with adolescent behavior, and how to appropriately respond to that behavior in their role as a correctional professional from a therapeutic perspective.</p>	<p>Supervising Juvenile Sex Offenders 2.0 hrs. This module will help participants understand the characteristics of juvenile sex offenders and treating sexual behaviors. This module will assist participants in understanding sexual development of adolescents while recognizing appropriate sexual behaviors. Strategies and tools are established to manage inappropriate sexual behaviors.</p>
<p>PBS Overview 1.5 hrs. This module provides an overview of PBS and how it improves conditions of confinement. PBS is a system for agencies and facilities to identify, monitor, and develop improvement plans for using national standards and outcome measures.</p>	<p>Suicide Prevention/Intervention 2.0 hrs. This module is designed to educate staff regarding juvenile suicide prevention and intervention in a correctional setting including ways to communicate and respond to a student who expresses suicidal or self injurious ideation.</p>
<p>Coaching in Action with Youth 2.5 hrs.
