

IJDA MEMBERSHIP MEETING

IJDA Fall Training and Retreat, Rising Star Casino, Rising Sun, IN (lunch break)

Tuesday, September 11, 2012

- I. Call to Order-** Jason Bowser called the meeting to order at 12:35pm.
- II. Introductions-** Introductions were made during the morning session of the training.
- III. Approval of August minutes-** Jim Higdon made a motion to approve August's minutes. Robert Jacobsen seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- IV. Treasurer's Report-** Jim Higdon reported that the current checking account balance is \$6,304.06. The current CD balance is \$9,911.82. The CD comes due in October.
- V. Committee Reports-**
 1. Membership- Robert Jacobsen reported that membership is still at 89.
 2. Trainings- April Dubree thanked everyone for attending the Fall Training that is currently being held. There were 43 registrants and approximately 41 in attendance, including attendees from the Madison Juvenile DOC facility.
The next training will be the 40 Hour Careworker Training being held in Madison County on Sept. 24-28. The cap of 30 has been reached, so registration is closed. They are still in need of 3 trainers for the week. Trainers must have attended one of the two Training for Trainers that have been given in the last 10 years. Trainers will be paid \$300 per day and will be reimbursed for mileage and hotel accommodations when applicable. If you are interested in being a trainer for this week, please contact April Dubree.

April reported that since we will not be returning to the same venue as last year, she has been researching hotels at which to hold the Summit. She is impressed with Caribbean Cove in Indianapolis and would like to hold the event there. Jim Higdon made a motion to hold the 2013 Summit at the Caribbean Cove in Indianapolis. Robert Belew seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Standards Review- Yul Lee gave the following report on behalf of Kellie Whitcomb. The IDOC Commissioner Bruce Lemmon has appointed an Advisory Committee to review and make recommendations regarding the Indiana Juvenile Detention Center Standards. The first meeting of the Advisory Committee is Sept. 18th. Once the members have confirmed their participation, a list of the Advisory Committee will be provided to Detention Center Directors.

6. Critical Issues- This committee will meet again next month and start to tackle pressing issues in the field of juvenile justice. The members are establishing position statements for IJDA based on NJDA position statements.

VI. D.O.C. Report-Yul Lee reported the following on behalf of Kellie Whitcomb. IDOC will be hosting a PREA Summit for Juvenile Detention Center Directors at the Correctional Training Institute in New Castle on October 29th from 9:00am or 9:30am lasting as long as there are questions, or until 3:00pm. Participants may include directors, asst. directors, and training coordinators. Participants will be expected to have received the new federal PREA Standards prior to the Summit.

IDOC will also be hosting the Indiana Juvenile Justice Training Model presentation, to Juvenile Detention Center Directors on November 13th, beginning at 10:30am and lasting until noon. Participants may include directors, asst. directors and training coordinators.

VII. Mental Health Project- April Dubree reported that there are currently 17 out of 22 centers participating in the Mental Health Project. There is nothing new to report at this time.

VIII. Detention Discussion- Tim Greathouse, Madison Juvenile Correctional Facility, asked the group what types of charges are facilities seeing the most. Discussion ensued. Tim gave interesting statistics from his facility.

IX. ICJI Report- Tashi Tseuchler reported that the DMC data report she mentioned during the training is available for viewing at icji.in.gov.

X. Youth Law T.E.A.M. Report- April Dubree thanked everyone on behalf of Laurie Elliott for their support for the YLT Fundraiser. There were approximately 75 tickets purchased. Several at risk youth will be able to attend the game thanks to your generosity and support.

XI. JDAI- Michelle Tennell reported that the state's JDAI team is expanding. Yul Lee, juvenile justice specialist with DOC, has been specifically assigned to JDAI. Indiana Supreme Court Justice David would like to see three additional sites added in 2013 and five additional sites in 2014.

XII. Old Business- No old business to discuss.

XIII. New Business- Nothing new to discuss.

XIV. Next meeting- The next meeting will be held at St. Joseph County at 10:30am EST. Summit Committee, PREA Committee, and Critical Issues Committee meetings to follow.
